

Cohen & Feeley Recovers nearly \$1 Million for Accident Victim

This case involved a very serious injury to the ankle and foot of a 42-year-old man. At the time the injury occurred, our client was an owner/operator of a home heating fuel truck. While in the process of loading his truck with fuel, he fell from the top on his truck, when the rope used to dispense the fuel, broke. The fall caused the fracture to the small bones throughout his foot, requiring many surgical procedures and ultimately, a fusion of his ankle, along with the implantation of a nerve stimulator for pain control.

Due to this injury, our client is limited in his ability to continue his work. It is projected that he will suffer a lifetime of pain and discomfort along with his physical limitations, which, among other things, require the use of a cane.

A lawsuit was filed in behalf of our client. Just prior to the scheduling of trial, the case was settled for \$935,000. A portion of this money was placed into a structured settlement for the client, allowing him to receive a lifetime monthly payment, in order to supplement his lost income.
